

# **Mission**

- To document well managed lcelandic fisheries to the highest level of assurance
- To preserve the fisheries management principles adopted by the international community
- To offer our customers choice in certification

# A clear focus on internationally accepted criteria - FAO Criteria

- UN FAO via, the COFI has set out the minimum criteria for responsible fisheries management
- A process with participation from all FAO member states offering consensus on those agreed criteria
- Iceland wanted to ensure that its certification was founded on this international consensus without exception
- Iceland Responsible Fisheries Management (IRFM) Standard is based on the 2005/09 FAO's Eco-labelling Guidelines for fish and fishery products from marine capture fisheries and places them in Icelandian fishery management context

### Direct participation in the standards setting process

- The IRFM scheme has given Icelandic fisheries direct participation in:
  - Standards setting process
  - Overall objectives and direction of IRFM
  - Procedures and processes for the certification system
- Result has been the adoption of a robust and meaningful third party certification system specific to the needs of Icelandic fisheries

#### Credible Standards and Certification – ISO and IAF

- Standards are set via an appointed committee of seafood stakeholders in Iceland
- The standard setting process and certification system are implemented in accordance with International ISO norms -ISO17065
- ...and formally accredited by a body member of the International Accreditation Forum (IAF)
- Accreditation oversight is maintained to ensure the ISO17065 requirements continue to be adhered to

# Competent and accredited third party certification

- The IRFM scheme uses only fully accredited, third party certification that has proven competency in fishery evaluation
- The programme follows FAO Guidelines for certification processes
- Certificates are valid for 5 years with annual surveillance audits
- Iceland can set the scheme requirements within the framework of ISO
- Rules are straight-forward, transparent and common sense
- Certificates are universal for Iceland fishers no exclusion of Icelandic fishers and no duplication
  - IRFM certified cod can only come from Iceland



#### **International benchmarks**

- With the advent of GSSI, a benchmark process has been adopted for seafood standards and certification systems that make claims of responsible practice and sustainability
- Iceland RFM now benchmarked and listed as a GSSI approved scheme
- This recognition adds further evidence that Iceland RFM meets international norms and FAO Criteria for credible, transparent and meaningful certification of fisheries



#### **Iceland RFM scheme**

- The result:
  - IRFM is specific to Icelandic values and needs
  - It remains truthful to the FAO criteria it does not dilute these
  - It allows for provenance IRFM is specific to Iceland.
  - It has internationally recognised accreditation ISO/IAF
  - It follows internationally recognised and agreed criteria FAO
  - It is GSSI recognised
